Dear Ms. Formusa,

Notwithstanding the numerous and significant costs being brought to bear on all residential electric consumers related to the GEA, a number disproportionately affect FOCA's membership who comprise a significant portion of the 150,000 members of the "Seasonal Class".

With changing demographics, many "cottagers" are making their cottages their permanent residence. So seasonal customers are often next door to a permanent resident and paying delivery charges significantly higher than their neighbour.

At 500 kwh/mo, the delivery portion of the bill is;

Urban Density	\$38.15
R1	\$45.57
R2	\$54.91
Seasonal	\$70.13

FOCA also notes that the distribution revenue to cost ratio for seasonal customers is well above that of the three other residential classes. We would request that a substantial downward adjustment of this ratio will come forward in your 2012 rate application to the OEB expected after the fall 2011 election.

We look forward to Hydro One's prompt response to these concerns from our many members across rural Ontario. A formal response to this letter would be appreciated.
