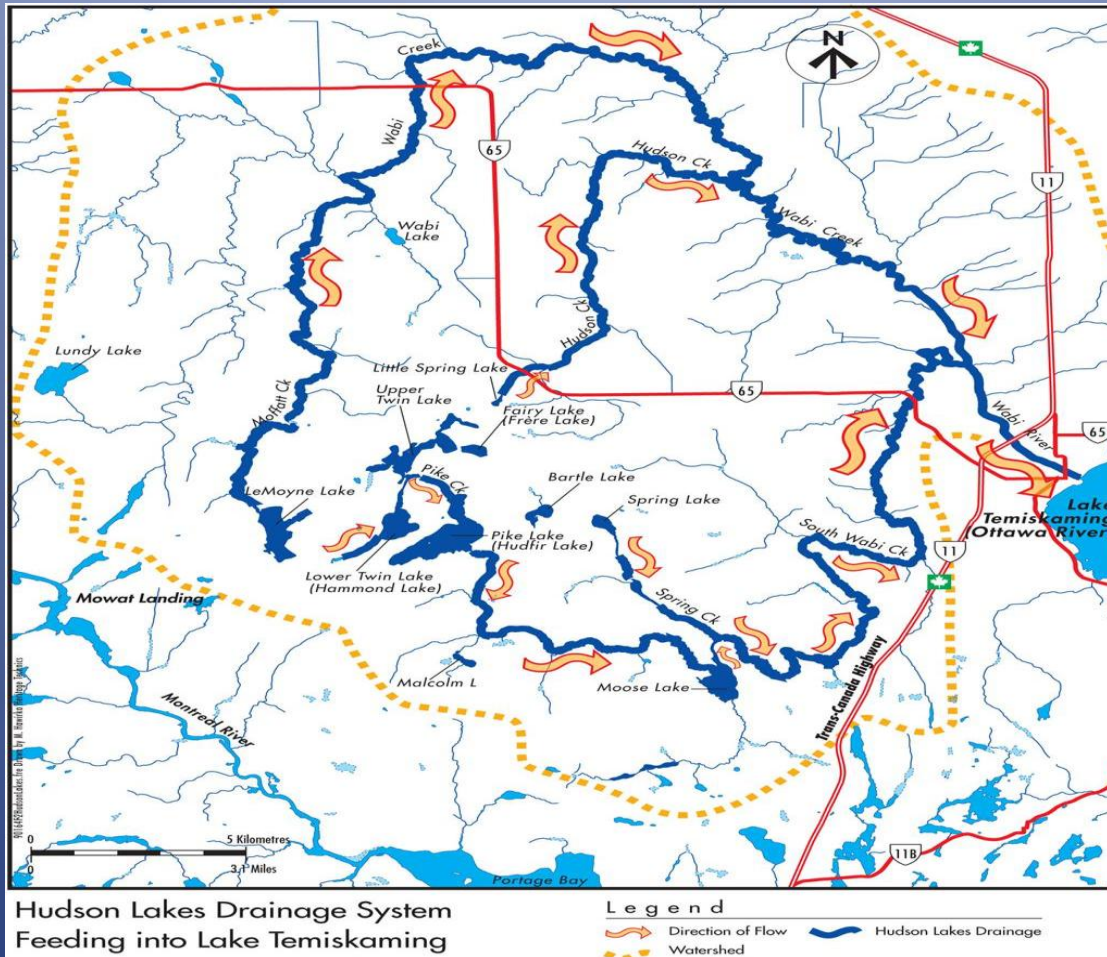

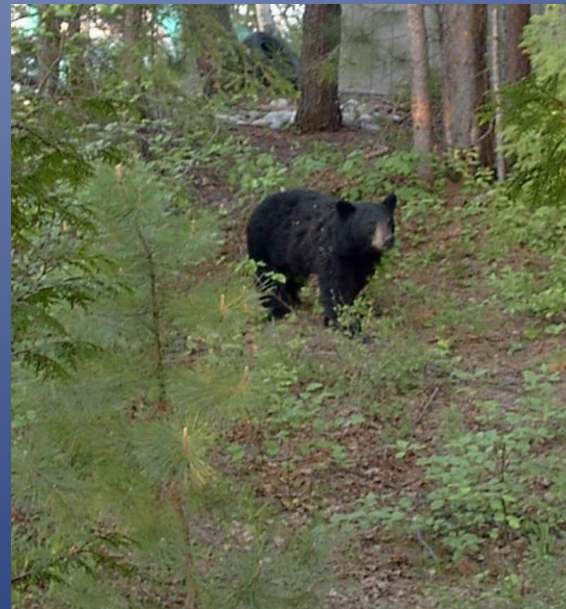


# Concerns
